Accurate proofreading and clear marking of corrections are indispensable requisites to the production of high quality publications. Proofreading is solely the authors' responsibility. Please read this section carefully.

Proofreading document is in PDF format and will be sent to the corresponding author. Acrobat Reader is needed for making corrections and can be downloaded from Adobe.com for free.

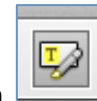
There will be only one chance of proofreading. You are advised to use the following general guidelines during proofreading:

- Make the necessary changes only.
- Proofread slowly and with great care.
- Be brief and exact in writing your corrections.
- Double check the spells of all authors' names and affiliated institution.
- Double check the information of correspondence.
- Make sure the figures and legends are correct.

Screenshots are provided below as examples for making corrections.


One Method for All:

The combination of **Highlighting** and **Pop-up Comment** is a very flexible tool. It can be used to do almost all the changes, including delete, insert, replace words. Here is how it works:



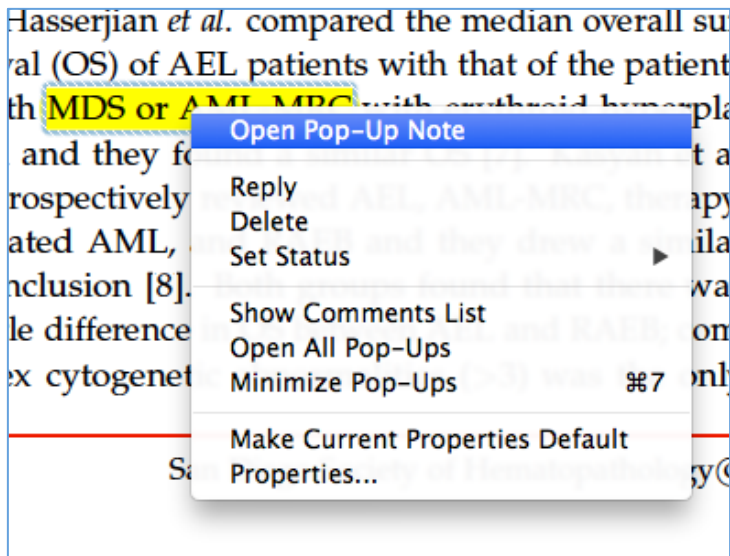
Select the word(s) and highlight them with “highlighting” button

The effect looks like the photo below:

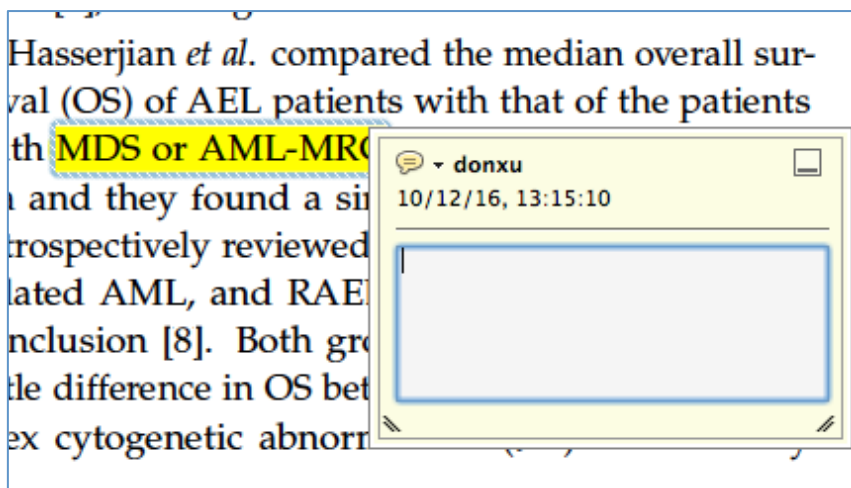

Move your cursor over the highlighted region and click the right button of the mouse, which will show a menu as below:

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Choose the **“Open Pop-Up Note”** at shown above, the Note window will open, shown below:



Insert a brief note to explain the change you want to make, such as:

delete the words

delete and replace with “xxxx”.

change to “xxxxx”.

This option works for almost all scenarios.
